Main Idea

Dr. Hagan and his wife Karen reflected on their 42-year marriage, emphasizing that while not every season may be positive, each experience can be redemptive. Our personal journey of faith shapes our worldview and relationships. We need to focus on redeeming our pain by learning lessons rather than dwelling on damage. The key is steadfast character and closeness to Jesus.

Key Verse: If you want a happy, good life, keep control of your tongue, and guard your lips from telling lies. (1 Peter 3:10, The Living Bible)

1. Influence in Relationships

There is value in listening to older generations and recognizing that previous knowledge is significant. There also needs to be a focus on mutual support in relationships—being poured into and pouring into others.

Read Jeremiah 29:4-10, Daniel 12:4

2. Responsibility in Relationships

We need to approach relationships with a mindset of giving rather than needing. It encourages seeking fulfillment from Jesus and coming to bless others.

3. Integrity in Relationships

Integrity in marriage involves aligning your thoughts, words, and actions. It emphasizes the importance of being thoughtful about what you think and say, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide your speech.
